7. *New Business*

a. ORCCA Presentation – Beth Barker-Hidalgo

Energy assistance – no established fire wood or refilling propane programs assist those who have need for those kinds of heating assistance. Camp Blanco RV is a new vender for propane in Port Orford. She's working with Larry Prestinezi at Lex's Landing. Colvin Oil said no when she asked for south county. She asked for input for south county contacts. Dennis Anderson for firewood as a vender. She's also the board chair for the Curry Homeless Coalition and as such she asked what can we do to help alleviate unintended consequences upon law enforcement regarding the homeless population. She wondered if they could house folks overnight they'd be less likely to commit crimes. She said expose (to the elements) is a problem also. Margolis asked if there is something like this going on in Coos County. Conde asked if there was a coalition member on call after hours for law enforcement to contact them. She said they need a screening process. Sevey offered to assist with that. Conde' said this is probably the biggest need is after hours and the person has nowhere to go. Interventions in the field. She said that ORCCA will be an outlet for Salvation Army resources which is \$140 per family which isn't in place yet and work out of the Harbor ORCCA Office. Coast Community Health is a partner and can help people in need and work with the office in Harbor. Margolis asked if there was one place that a person can get info about all the resources available. Consolidated information that is up to date. If each police agency had them. The issue with the 211 is that the database for our area is sparsely populated. She said a one stop location would be best to access resources. Conde' said to follow up on that is the list available in areas where folks are most likely to find them. ORCCA has an advisory committee and the next meeting is in May. Sevey will forward that meeting date to everyone when she gets it.

- a. *Boice said that immediately following this meeting is a meeting he's having with the a Commissioner of Coos County and the SCINT director.*
- b. *Margolis announced that there is a new Trial court Administrator meet and greet today.*
- c. *Antunes said that she wanted to mention an Issue with children regarding drug endangered protocols and meth labs and also consumables and children overdoing on those. Denney said there is a group called Clear Alliance that is a group that will come to schools and talk.*
- d. *Espinoza gave a follow up on a previous meeting's discussion topic - NARCAN training – all the patrol, P & P and corrections staff have taken the training on this opiate overdoes protocol for the antidote. CCH is involved.*
