# WEEKLY BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES July 24, 2019

## 1. CALL TO ORDER & PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was called to order by Chair Paasch at 5:00 p.m. Present were Chair Christopher Paasch, Vice-Chair Court Boice, Commissioner Sue Gold.

Also present: Legal Counsel John Huttl, Director of Operations Julie Schmelzer, Administrative Assistant John Jezuit.

The Pledge was recited by all.

## 2. AMENDMENT/APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Schmelzer pulled Item 4H and Item 4K; Paasch pulled Item 4E.

Motion by Gold, seconded by Boice, to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried unanimously.

#### 3. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Brice Wagner spoke about the condition of Elk River US Forest Service Road and recommended a road grader to smooth out ruts. Ann Vileisis agrees with Brice Wagner, thanks the Board for coming to Port Orford, and asked about status of the Floras Lake property. Tim Palmer spoke about the AFRC (American Forest Resource Council) presentation at the July 24, 2019, workshop urging the Board to recognize the issues are complex and asking the Board to hear from people on other side of this issue. Dave Bassett thanked the Board for attending the SWOCC (Southwestern Oregon Community College) meeting in Brookings on July 15, 2019 and stated Rogue Community College dropped vocational programs for trade people.

## 4. PRESENTATIONS

A. Tsunami Siren/Education Presentation – Jeremy Dumire

Jeremy Dumire, Emergency Management Coordinator showed a PowerPoint presentation covering the future of Curry County tsunami sirens. Dumire spoke about tsunami types, the length of time before landfall for each type, the evacuation response for each type, and the role the 17 Curry County tsunami warning sirens perform. Dumire recommends discontinuing usage of the Curry County tsunami warning sirens because:

- only 4 of the 17 sirens are working;
- the cost to repair, relative to his budget, is excessive;

- the sound coverage of each siren is less than a mile radius;
- majority of warning messages are via cell phone;
- the recently renewed contract with Everbridge, a company specializing in mass notifications, provides cell phone warning messages.

Motion by Gold, seconded by Boice, to bring back a resolution discontinuing use of the tsunami warning sirens. Motion carried unanimously.
